

New! Alternate Week Recycling Collection

Important Changes to your Recycling Pick Up Schedule & Procedure

Effective January 1, 2019, cardboard and paper products will NOT be picked up the same week as bottles, cans and plastic #1- #6. Pick up will be on alternating weeks:

Cardboard and paper will be picked up one week along with waste.

Bottles, cans and plastic #1- #6 will be picked up the next week along with waste.

This change will improve efficiency, reduce costs, use less fuel and reduce carbon emissions.

Cardboard & Paper Only

What must I recycle?

- Newspaper
- Office paper/envelopes
- Magazines & Junk mail
- Phone & paperback books
- Cardboard boxes & packaging e.g., cereal, pasta boxes
- Shipping/appliance boxes (Remove all packing material)

How do I prepare cardboard & paper for pick up?

Choose any or a combination of the following options:

1. ***Preferred:** Place items directly in your existing recycling bin or an old garbage pail. **Do not bag or bundle.** Clearly mark the pail with the decal enclosed and use this pail only for cardboard and paper.
2. Create a bundle: Tie newspaper and other materials into bundles with cord or twine, no higher than 10 inches high and 36 inches long or put in a paper bag.
3. Put shipping, appliance, gift boxes directly out for collection—**No need to break them down.**



Commingled Glass, Cans & Plastic #1-6 Only

What must I recycle?

- Glass bottles (clear and colored)
- Foil pie plates & Aluminum foil (Clean)
- Metal bottle caps
- Metal cans including empty aerosol cans
- Plastic containers and plastic #1- #6

How do I prepare bottles, cans, glass and plastic #1-#6 for pick up?

Place items directly in your existing recycling pail or an old garbage pail. **Do not use recycling bags.** Clearly mark the pail with the decal enclosed and use this pail only for bottles, cans, glass and plastic #1-#6.

*Everything must be rinsed.





RECYCLING MARKET CHANGES LIMIT ACCEPTABLE RECYCLABLES

Recycling buyers will no longer accept contaminated recyclables and certain types of plastics due to changes in the recycling market. Please carefully review and follow these **NEW RULES** for what can and cannot be recycled in North Castle.

RECYCLABLE PLASTIC AND GLASS

(Must be clean and rinsed)

- Plastic bottles with recycling nos. 1 - 6
- Plastic containers with recycling nos. 1 - 6
- Glass bottles and jars
- Aluminum cans (including beer, soda, vegetable, soup)
- Plastic jugs (including laundry detergent bottles) with recycling symbol nos. 1 - 6
- Empty aerosol cans
- Plastic and metal coffee cans

RECYCLABLE CARDBOARD AND PAPER

(Must be clean and dry)

- Cardboard boxes without packing materials
- Fed Ex and UPS type boxes with plastic label sleeve removed
- Direct mail and magazines
- Brown paper bags
- Pasta and cereal boxes
- Shoe boxes with tissue and packing materials removed
- Newspaper
- Envelopes that do not have plastic attached
- Non-soiled aluminum foil

THE "NEW" NO's

Items that are no longer accepted in recycling:

- No wax cardboard containers (like brown take out containers)
- No prescription/medicine bottles
- No coffee cups, no coffee cup hot sleeves and no coffee cup lids or straws
- No paper towel or toilet paper cores
- No pizza boxes (causes contamination)
- No frozen food boxes
- No juice boxes or milk/juice cartons
- No plastic gardening pots
- No cardboard egg cartons

ITEMS THAT NEVER WERE RECYCLABLE:

- Styrofoam
- Plastic bags, including dry cleaning bags
- Plastic or metal hangers
- Shrink wrap
- Snack bags
- Laundry baskets
- Metal items like furniture, utensils
- Compostable items
- Plastic toys

THE RULES OF RECYCLING HAVE CHANGED. WHEN IN DOUBT IT IS BETTER TO THROW AN ITEM OUT WITH YOUR WASTE RATHER THAN RISK CONTAMINATING THE RECYCLABLES. ALMOST 30% OF RECYCLED ITEMS END UP IN LANDFILLS DUE TO CONTAMINATION.

REMEMBER-IT IS BEST TO REDUCE, THEN REUSE AND FINALLY RECYCLE.

RECYCLING


North Castle is required to recycle paper, plastics, glass and metal. **All items must be placed loose in clearly marked recycling bins.**

Do not place recyclables in any plastic bags. (see recycling stickers included in this schedule) Recycle bins are available for purchase at the Town Clerk's Office. No plastic bags can be accepted within recycling. For Town online updates go to northcastleny.com.

How do I know what plastics are recyclable?

Look for the chasing arrows recycling symbol located on the container. It must contain a #1 through #6. Only bottles and jars displaying these symbols are recyclable and accepted.

Tell me what is recyclable and what is not.

Dish detergent and fabric softener bottles	NO Styrofoam, hangers, vinyl or toys

ALUMINUM	
Food cans (such as soup, fruit, vegetable and juice) and pet food cans	NO hangers, toasters, can openers, microwaves or metal furniture
Beverage and empty aerosol cans. Clean aluminum foil, pie plates and trays.	NO bulk trash metal (such as aluminum siding, scrap metal, including pipes, tubing) batteries and paint cans.
GLASS	
All clear, green and brown glass jars and bottles any size	NO ceramics or pottery, light bulbs or window and mirror glass
Clean food and beverage containers only. UNBROKEN bottles and jars.	NO cookware or ovenware, drinking glasses or pesticide/herbicide bottles. NO fluorescent bulbs.
PAPER AND CARDBOARD	
All newspapers, Phone books, Paper back books, Penny-saver, Colored and glossy periodicals, Magazines and Catalogs, Junk mail, Brown paper bags (Place all above material in brown paper bag or loose in recycling bin)	NO hard covered books Wax coated containers, towel rollers and egg cartons
Cardboard and cardboard boxes, corrugated cardboard	NO larger than 6' x 4'
Gray/Compressed or smoothed Cardboard ex. tissue boxes, pizza boxes, but they must be clean	
Newsprint, High Grade Paper	

YARD WASTE

Private contractors are responsible for removing their own debris

Brush shall be curbside by Monday of the scheduled pickup week and no earlier than one week prior to scheduled pickup as described in the North Castle Brush Pick Up Schedule. **DO NOT USE PLASTIC BAGS.** The Town will not pick up any grass, dirt, whole trees, logs and stumps.

Curbside/Back door Collection

- Back door service is available for a monthly fee.
- All waste and recycling must be available by 7:00 AM on collection days.
- Waste containers must not be larger than 32 gallons.
- Recycling containers must not be larger than 32 gallons.
- Waste and recycling containers may not be stored where they are visible from the street.
- Waste and recycling containers cannot be left on the street.
- Waste and recycling containers shall not be placed at the curb any earlier than 4 PM of the day prior to collection and must be removed no later than 12 hours after collection.
- Back door collection will only be made when driveway is free of snow, vehicles and other obstacles.
- Only the driver can determine if the driveway can be negotiated safely.

PAINT CANS MUST BE SOLIDIFIED (TOTALLY DRIED OUT) THEN CAN BE PLACED IN REGULAR GARBAGE

Bulk and large item pick up:

- Residents must call Suburban Carting at 1-800-273-9394 before placing items at curbside.
- Bulk and large items must not be wider than 3 feet.
- Must be at the curb by 7:00 AM.
- Shall not be placed at curbside earlier than 3 days prior to your pickup day.
- No bulk pickup during holiday weeks, limited to 4 cubic yards per pickup.

CHRISTMAS TREES

Christmas tree pick up shall be performed by the Highway Department seasonally, pursuant to a schedule established by the Highway Department.

Some examples of Things Not Collected

Electronic waste, Construction and debris, be it lumber, concrete, dirt, sheetrock, plaster, rock, brick, asphalt, roofing material, kitchen cabinets, pipes, tile, toilets, windows, fencing, garage and regular doors, sinks, hot water heaters, etc. For more information, please call: Suburban Carting at 1-800-273-9394.
